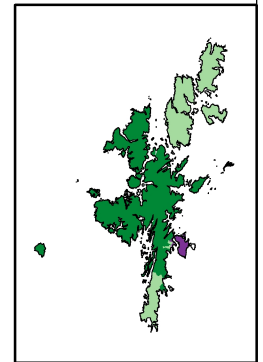
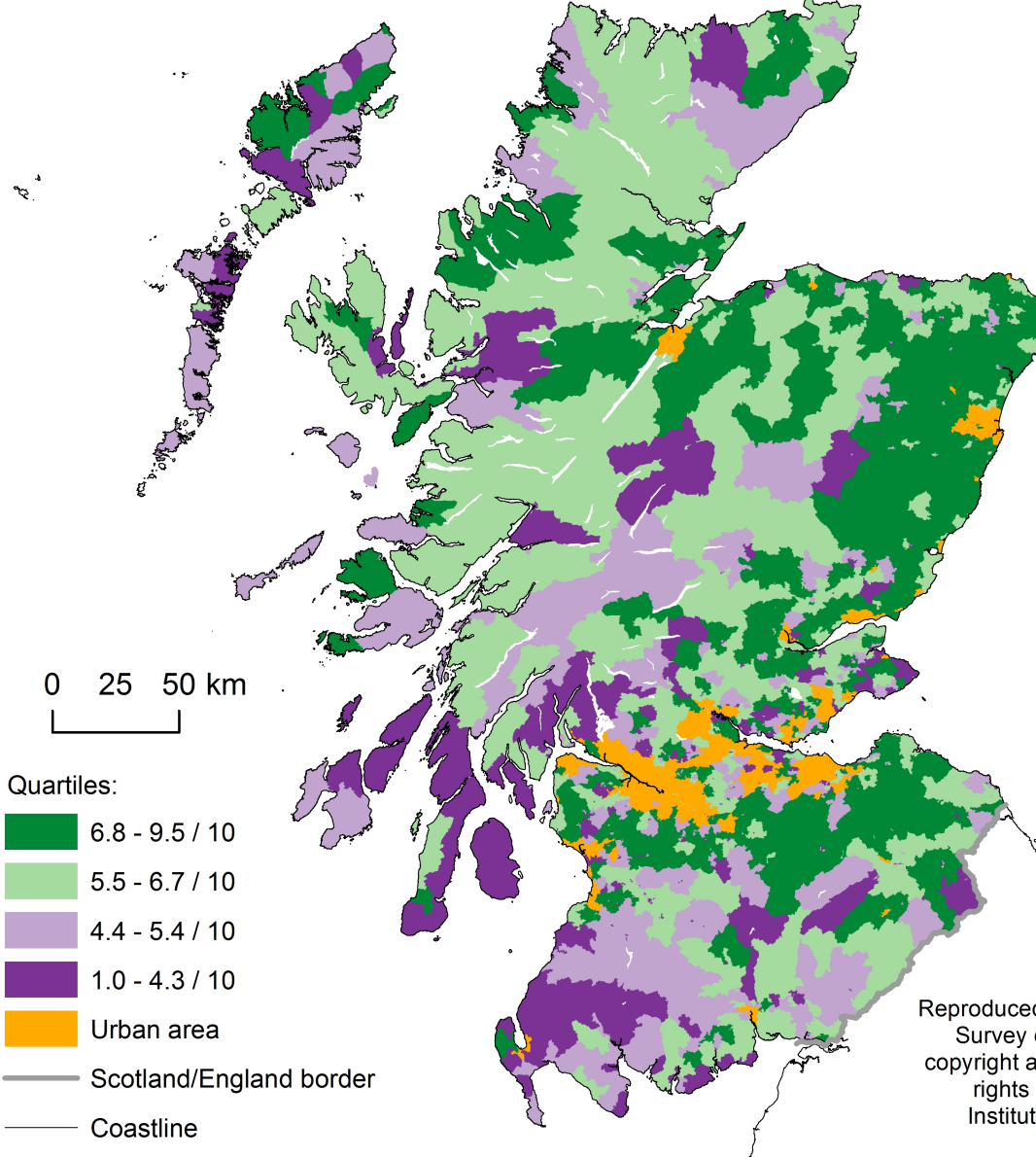


Strategic Objective score: Safer and Stronger (2011)

Data shown: quartiles for data zones in rural areas and small towns. Scores have a theoretical range from 1-10, with higher values showing better performance.

Data shown: mean scores, +/- 1 standard deviation, dotted line shows mean score (all data zones in analysis)

Summary: The data shows higher average ratings for demographic/economic strength and safety in rural areas, controlling for accessibility, compared with small towns. There was evidence of poorer performance with greater remoteness from urban areas.
